UC Recruit - New Process

Beginning September 1, 2015, UC Recruit replaced the campus Academic Recruitment Packet as the tool for documenting searches for academic positions.

To prepare for the transition, training sessions were held for departmental staff.

The complete recruitment process will be managed in one place allowing better data management and reporting and less duplication of effort; more consistent application of policies and procedures as well as being compliant with Federal requirements.

Paper Academic Recruitment Packets will no longer be accepted.

Since this is a new tool, updates on its use will continue to be provided to users.

July 1, 2015 Academic Salary Adjustments

President Napolitano approved an across-the-board salary scale adjustment for faculty and other non-represented academic employees. The 1.5% salary scale adjustment will be retroactive to July 1, 2015 and will appear on the October 1, 2015 paycheck.

A supplemental Senate Faculty Salary increase has also been approved. Each eligible faculty member will receive an additional 1% increase based on the original, pre-range adjusted salary. The 1% increase takes into account equity concerns on comparisons of UCSB salaries to other UC campuses and peer institutions. For Assistant Professor II through Professor IX and for all Lecturers in the SOE series, the increase will be applied as an off-scale supplement. For Professor Above Scale the total salary will be increased by 1%.

For Non-Senate Academic Employees

Each eligible employee will receive an additional increase of 1%. The 1% is based on the original, pre-range adjusted salary. The increases will be granted as an increase in off-scale supplement.

Due to rounding, increases may be slightly less or slightly more that the stated percentages.
