Workload and Course Equivalencies

Description of Instructional Offering

A. Instructional Workload Course (IWC)

Definition: Regularly scheduled instructional offering requiring significant academic preparation outside class and meeting a minimum of three hours per week. (1.00 IWC)

B. Course Equivalencies (Values in terms proportionate to an IWC)

Honors Sections (one section per lecturer per quarter) (\$1,500 per quarter, 1/qtr max, from donor funds)

C. Other Equivalencies

Voluntary non-standard courses (e.g. directed research, projects, industry internships, independent studies) (0.00 IWC)

Co-curricular program service and/or program administrative assignments requiring 75-100 hours of related duties per academic year. Examples include, but are not restricted to, the following:

- 1) Accounting Program Liaison (1.00 IWC/year max)
- 2) Accounting Program Curriculum Advising (1.00 IWC/year max)
- 3) Training/supervising tutors/readers (1.00 IWC/year max)
- 4) Coordinating/supervising on-campus recruitment activities for students (1.00 IWC/year max)
- 5) Advising/supervising Accounting Association (1.00 IWC/year max)
- 6) Undergraduate advising duties, including transcript and course evaluation, student advising, and other administrative activities related to the running of the undergraduate program (2.00 IWC/year max)

Maximum workload credit for assigned supervisory or administrative duties shall not exceed 2.00/year/lecturer. Department funds may be used to pay one of these IWCs during the summer for work performed in the summer.
